Editorial

I've quietly criticised one particular local magazine for including political views, so I shan't include the election results. As to the football - the less said the better. As to the tennis - it looks like the 'old guard' is finally being replaced by younger champions. If you're a labour voter with a Spanish background, July must have been a pretty happy month.

My favourite activity in July is to watch the Tour de France on the television. If ever there was a sport designed for TV, cycling must be near the top of the list.

If you go to France and stand by the road to watch the Tour, the view you have of the riders lasts for just a few moments. If you're really committed to the sport, you'll then travel a hundred miles or so, for a view of the next day's racing. There, once again, you'll catch a fleeting glimpse of the riders as they fly past once again. Watching on TV is much more civilised.

There are 21 days of racing and the riders pedal for 3,500km (2,174 miles). There are flat, sprint stages - where the heavyweight riders make a mad dash to the final line. There are mountain stages - where the lightweight riders pedal at speed up ridiculous inclines to the top. There are a couple of time trials, where the riders are alone against the clock.

There are three main competitions within the Tour: the Green Jersey (best sprinter), the Polkadot Jersey (best mountain climber) and the G.C. Yellow Jersey (General Classification - fastest over all types of road).

As I write, the leader of the G.C. - the wearer of the Yellow Jersey - is Tadej Pogacar from Slovenia. Second is Jonas Vingegaard from Denmark. Third is Remco Evenepoel from Belgium. The wearer of the Green Jersey is Biniam Girmay of Eritrea.

So, although I might become a couch potato in July each year, my knowledge of world geography is improving.

Haw Lane views from years gone by



Haw Lane in 1938. To the left is Mrs Syers, a resident of Hellifield for many years.

The ladies in this photograph above from 1938 are sitting on a seat on the bankside of Haw Lane just up from the railway crossing. Looking towards the camera, the view beyond is represented in the photograph at the top of the next page. This photograph from the late 1960's - looks towards the railway, and the village below shows a scene which was to change little in the years since 1938. The main change would have been the demolition of the old Station House and associated railway buildings in the early 1970's. This was the site of Hellifield's original station which was replaced in importance when the new station was constructed by the Midland Railway and was opened for use on the 1st June 1880. The main difference from the 1960's view and the same view today, is the absence of houses on the field to the right of Haw Grove, and various Auction Mart buildings which are also seen to the right of the photograph.

Note the well cut grass and the absence of today's overgrowth of hedges which feature in the top photograph. The seat the ladies are sitting on is (as far as I'm aware) still in situ, but is now hidden and, no doubt, quietly rotting away amongst all the bushes and undergrowth which has appeared over the last 30 years. I say the last 30 years because I distinctly remember sitting on it myself back in the early 1990's. Note the condition of the lane itself compared to today's rough and stony surface.

In the photograph at the bottom of the next page, new houses have been built from the late 1990's, now covering this area. Originally this area contained numerous sidings, engine shed, turntable and cattledocks. In the far top right of the photo the group of buildings represent John Winders farm. The caravans and lodges of the Gallaber we know today were still many years in the future.

Above: Cows graze in this 1960's photo, where houses now stand. The lane running left to right is called Occupation Lane, and was used by the railway and auction mart for driving cattle to and from the cattle dock which was situated on the old railway land in the centre of the photo. Also on this land stood the L & Y engine shed and turntable. L& Y Terrace (former railway houses) is at the left of the photo, with a lane below leading to the Auction Mart.



Left: Looking down onto Haw Grove and Thorndale Street in the 1960's. The view shows Mart Farm in the centre and its adjoining croft. In the top background 'The Grange' (Skidmore's Farm) can be seen.



Above: The houses built by the council in the 1920's, with its large patch of greenery in the middle. Not many cars in this 1960's photo. The field in the rear was for many years used as the football / cricket pitch and gala field.

The depression at top left is an old quarry and was known locally as the 'Camels Hump'.

North Craven Flower Club

Someone asked me recently, how do you make flowers last once bought/picked. The difficulty is that different flowers need different things and flowers in the garden have an optimum time for picking to make them last the longest. Generally, all flowers last best in water rather than oasis. Also changing the water as often as you can, recommended to do it every day, makes a big difference. Strip the stems so that no leaves are in the water. Cut about half an inch from each stem before adding them to your arrangement.

Below are some tips given by Judith Blacklock who is a lecturer, demonstrator and teacher worldwide. She has published several books and is a past editor of the Flower Arranger magazine.

- Leaves should be healthy and not yellow.
- Loose pollen on the petals is an indication that the flowers are nearing their end.
- Some flowers naturally live longer when cut such as carnations and chrysanthemums. Iris, sweet peas and stocks will not last as long.
- 4. Flowers that are scented, tend to not last as long.



5. Flowers from bulbs such as daffodils, anemones and tulips last longer in shallow not deep water.

Looking at some flowers that are in season now and what to do to make them last longer.

- Agapanthus only buy stems where there are only a few flowers open on each stem.
- Lady's Mantle (Alchemilla mollis) Check that flowers are not too tight, as once cut they might not fully open.
- Alstroemeria Buy stems that have at least one bud that has already opened. The leaves should be green and not yellow.
- Anthurium Avoid touching the wax like spathes. The Spadix should be more white than yellow. It gets darker with age.
- Astrantia The flowers will wilt if the stem has been cut when the flowers are immature. The flowers should be open and the stems strong.
- Antirrhinum (snapdragon) Don't purchase/cut flower stems that are bent as they will not straighten. There should be a good show of flowers at the bottom of the stem that are fresh and not wilting.

- Chrysanthemum Check for browning in the centre of the flower and they shouldn't have released any of their yellow pollen.
- Dahlia Check that the outer petals are firm and that the petals at the centre of the flower are still tight.
- Delphiniums Foliage shouldn't be damaged and the flowers at the bottom of the stem should be fresh and not wilted.
- Gladiolus Remove the tips as these will not open and removing them stimulates the buds further down the stem to open.
- Helianthus (Sunflowers) Avoid buying flowers that have loose pollen at the centre as they won't last. Retain one or two leaves near the head to pull water up the stems more easily.
- Roses There should be no browning on the petals, as this is a sign of age. Leave some leaves near the flower as again this helps to draw up water. If you pick too

tightly closed buds in your garden, they are unlikely to open so pick flowers that have already started to open. If fully open, they won't last that long.

I hope this is helpful although it's only a few of the flowers that are in season now.

Delivering the evening news (1970s style!)

In the early 1970s, before the advent of the internet and 24-hour TV news, evening editions of local newspapers were a popular way for people to keep up to date with happenings on a local and national basis. Two editions were available to the folks of Hellifield in those days, these were the Bradford Telegraph and Argus and the Yorkshire Evening Post, both of which were delivered around the village by myself after my school day had ended.

In those days the papers were delivered from the printers to Skipton bus station and then would be sorted on to the various local buses heading up to the dales. The papers for Hellifield would be loaded onto our local bus which, at that time, was operated by the Pennine motor company of Gargrave on its route from Skipton to Ingleton. (Pennine buses ceased to operate in 2014) and collected at the appointed stops by the local paper lads. The newspapers, wrapped in brown paper and tied with string would be stowed on the overhead luggage racks on these

vehicles. I must have annoyed many passengers as I attempted to pull out each parcel from the rack to read the handwritten label until I found the correct one, in the process often showering the unfortunate passengers sat beneath with rainwater or snow from my anorak if it was an inclement night. Pennine buses carried guite a few parcels in those days, I remember boxes of auto parts bound for Ellis's garage in Settle and animal medicines for the vets also in Settle, to name but two. The bus stop in the village at this time was the double streetlamp located in the middle of the junction of Gisburn

road and the A65, in later years the stop was moved further down by the old smithy. The Pennine drivers were always a cheery and good-natured bunch and some of them would sort the papers into the order of stops and have them ready to collect by the bus door.

With the papers collected it was on to Preston's our local newsagent's shop which was located on main road next door to Barclays bank (now the Little Beauty room). Once at the shop I would sort the papers into my order of delivery. There were so many papers that I couldn't fit them all into my bag for one trip so I sorted them into two lots, dividing the village in half using the railway bridge over the main road as my dividing line. Once sorted, it was on my bike and away. I could usually cover each half of the village in little over half an hour in good weather but in winter it would sometimes take a lot longer as streets such as Midland Terrace and Brook Street could be quite treacherous for a bike in snowy

The photo on the left shows me on my bike ready to go and meet the 5pm bus. It was taken at the rear of our cottage on Bacon Terrace.

I remember this bike very well, it was a Raleigh "Wayfarer" with royal blue paintwork and a single speed gear and was the first brand new bike I ever had.

Previously, my bikes were assembled by my dad in his shed from his stockpile of old parts. I remember I took my cycling proficiency test at Hellifield primary school on a dad-built bike that utilised a girl's frame! Despite this and with the help of PC Peacock, who was one of our local policemen, I passed the test and I've still got the certificate and badge to prove it!


